2010 City Beautification Award Jungle Terrace Civic Association



The **Peggy Allen Award** honors the private initiative of groups whose volunteer efforts enhance the natural beauty of Saint Petersburg and promote the public stewardship of our environmental resources. The 2010 Award is presented to Jungle Terrace Civic Association (JTCA) for their long term efforts in improving Walter Fuller Park.

Work began in 2000 with a City grant to develop a Neighborhood Plan, approved by Council in November 2001. The Walter Fuller Park Plan, part of the Neighborhood Plan, featured new 8 foot wide sidewalks, three new lake shelters, additional trees, new picnic shelters near the Recreation Center, new parking lot, new dog park, revamped playground facilities, and moving the BMX track to a location in the County.

Funding and actual work proceeded over the next nine years until project completion in 2009. This large, long-term collaborative effort by the City and Jungle Terrace Civic Association has produced a 133 acre park that is one of the Crown Jewels in our City's extensive park system.

Late 2009, to further improve Walter Fuller Park, a Volunteers Celebration Garden with extensive landscaping of constantly flowering bushes, large river boulders, and bronze statuary was installed by JTCA volunteers who continue to provide all maintenance for this garden.

The City Beautiful Commission takes great pleasure in recognizing the persistent and continuing work of the Jungle Terrace Civic Association in making their neighborhood a more beautiful location in which to work, live and play.

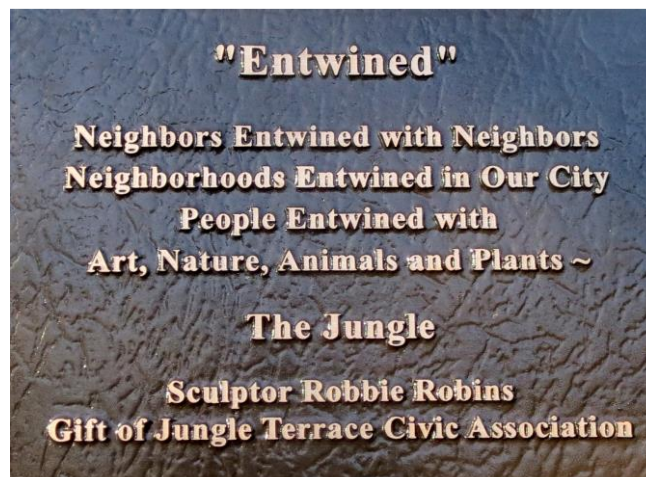

In the Florida House, Representative Peters serves on the Economic Affairs Committee, Justice Appropriations, Transportation & Economic Development Appropriations Subcommittee, Transportation and Ports Subcommittee, and as Vice Chair for the Children, Families & Seniors Subcommittee.

Rep. Peters achieved measurable success in the Florida legislature. Most notable are her efforts to reform mental health and substance use system. After extensive research, she brought statewide stakeholders to the table creating sweeping reform of a new infrastructure to ensure access and a continuum of quality care for anyone suffering from mental illness and/or addiction. She also passed legislation to address the extreme workforce shortage within this system.

Additional successful legislation passed ensures utility companies cannot take advantage of citizens through creative billing processes, eliminates taxes and fees for submerged land owners living in a condominium, ensures veterinarians can

compound medications to provide fast and effective treatment to their patients, eliminates potential fraud while allowing greater options for citizens to meet the vision care needs, and ensures veterans have the opportunity to continue their education at residential tuition rates.

Kathleen began her political career when elected to the South Pasadena City Commission in 2008 and served as Mayor from 2009 until she was elected to the Florida House in 2012. Prior to politics, she worked for the Juvenile Welfare Board of Pinellas County, the YMCA of St Petersburg, and the Clearwater Regional Chamber of Commerce.

Representative Peters has received numerous awards and recognition for her work and advocacy in youth development, juvenile justice, mental health, law enforcement, protecting home rule, and her extensive work on homeless issues.
